Mead believed that without language we could not think. And, therefore, our "mind" is a social product.

- Feral children (wild animals)
- Isolated children
- Institutionalized children (mental health)

It has been theorized that socialization effects:

- what we get emotional about (e.g., guilt, shame, sadness, happiness, fear, anger), and
- 2. how we express our emotions

Stages of Development

Imitation children under 3

Play children 3-6 take roles of specific people

Games early school, takes multiple roles

Charles Cooley's theory named "The Looking Glass Self"

The process by which a self develops.

- (1) We imagine how we appear to others.
- (2) We interpret others' reactions.
- (3) We develop a self-concept.


